April Guest Speaker

Our April speaker will be Texas Rangers Chief Jason Taylor. Chief Taylor began his more than 24-year career with DPS as a Texas Highway Patrol Trooper serving in various duty stations in Region 2. He also served as a Sergeant/ Investigator with the Criminal Investigations Division in the Special Crimes Service in Garland, and the DPS Criminal Intelligence Service in Houston.

Taylor was then accepted into the Texas Rangers Division – his first assignment was with Company "F" - Waco and later with Company "A" - Houston. He promoted to Ranger Lieutenant in 2011, Captain in 2014, and was subsequently assigned to oversee the Public Integrity Unit (PIU) at Austin Headquarters before promoting to Ranger Major in Houston. Taylor earned a Bachelor of Science degree in criminal justice from Sam Houston State University, and is a graduate of the Northwestern University School of Police Staff and Command. Major Taylor routinely volunteers with Spindletop Youth Charities and the Houston Livestock Show and Rodeo, where he serves on the Emergency Response Team.

The Police Chief will provide direction and planning for the growth and development of all police services and is responsible for the overall success of the department. The ideal candidate will be a strong leader, with a demonstrated track record of accountability, who also sets high standards for those who serve in the department. The selected candidate should be a community-focused, innovative manager who is open, honest, and can garner respect through unimpeachable integrity, while fostering a culture of trust in the department and the community.

The selected candidate will hold a bachelor's degree in management, criminal justice, or a closely related field from an accredited college or university. A minimum of 15 years of experience in the police profession, including 10 years of supervisory experience; at least 4 of which should be in a command position in a medium to large municipal police department, is required. A valid Texas vehicle operator's license, or the ability to obtain one within ninety (90) days of the start of employment, are required.

Preferred qualifications:

- Candidates who hold a current peace officer license and an Advanced Peace Officer certification by the Texas Commission on Law Enforcement.
- A master's degree
- Completion of a nationally recognized management college, such as the FBI National Academy, Southern Police Institute, ILEA, LEMIT, PERF's Senior Management Institute for Police or a comparable program or programs.

The salary range for this position is in the \$140s depending on qualifications and experience.
